**Burnaby Eco-Sculptures** - Set out on a trip to find all the eco-sculptures spread throughout the city. Also known as topiary, these sculptures are created out of living plants and take the form of various animals such as a bear, bees, salmon and even carousel horses outside the Burnaby Village Museum. **Burnaby Mountain** - As if the view of Burnaby Mountain Park wasn't enticing enough of a reason to visit, the conservation area also features the Centennial Rose Garden and the Playground of the Gods. Stop and smell the more than 900 roses or marvel at the wooden carved poles by Japanese Ainu.
