The Nanaimo Art Gallery is honoured to display the ceramic work of Saltspring based artist Charles Breth.

This exhibition entitled "Body of Evidence" features figurative sculptures from over the last three years by this exceptional artist. The sculptures are created by hand using age old techniques such as coil, slab and pinch pot processes and are fired with a terra sigillata solution of very fine clay particles most prominently used by the Greeks and Romans of antiquity.

Breth regards his work as addressing " the contemporary human dilemma of retaining autonomy and dignity under conditions of instability, fragmentation and displacement. These representations seek a way among the pitfalls of caricature, coy realism, sentiments of beauty, pornographic sensationalism and many other forms of the grotesque that maneuver for attention in contemporary culture and society."

The public is invited to view this fascinating body of work from May 13th to August 20th 2011 at the campus gallery. The opening commences on Friday, May 13th from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. The artist will be in attendance.

This exhibition provides an opportunity to reflect on the nature of forced separation and uprooting and the effects that it has on its victims. After the bombing of Pearl Harbor in 1941, both the Canadian and American governments forced the relocation of citizens of Japanese descent from the coastal regions. Nearly 120,000 Japanese Americans and 22,000 Japanese Canadians were affected. The internment camps for the Japanese Americans were scattered around the US west. In Canada, the B.C. Security Commission was established to oversee the removal to hastily planned camps in the BC interior, or to work and road camps in other parts of the country

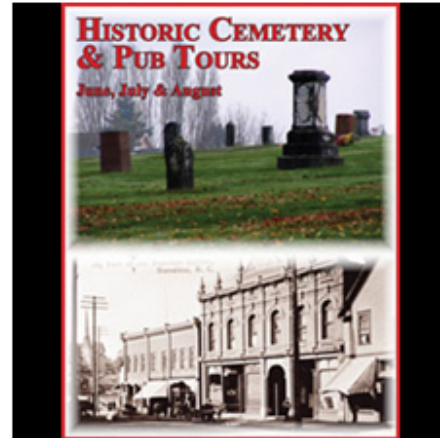

Historical Pub Tour

This pub tour, with Nanaimo Museum, comes with a difference. It's both historical and personal in nature. You will hear about the buildings and how people used them, as well as the development of the BC liquor laws.

One such important building was the Eagle Hotel built in 1922. It actually replaced two earlier hotels, the Oriental and the Identical both built in 1874, and both wooden structures. The Eagle Hotel's name was changed to the Terminal because of its closeness to the CPR terminal. It is now called the Cambie Hostel. It was typical of most early Nanaimo hotels in that it catered to the single and often transient men. The living quarters were on the upper floors and restaurants and saloons on the first floor. It has been in continuous use as a hotel for over 100 years.



Well into the late 1800s liquor was considered healthy and nutritious, even by doctors. Water had the opposite reputation and, in most cities, this was well deserved. Alcohol was cheaper than milk, coffee and tea. In fact early saloons were meeting places, often the cheapest place to eat and there was no age restriction. In the evening the family would gather in the nearest tavern to hear the latest gossip and news. Men went there to eat, sleep, exchange gossip, gamble, pick up the mail, find a job and cash a cheque. Liquor had long been consumed in Nanaimo but it wasn't until 1858 that the first liquor license was issued to the Nanaimo Coal Company, a subsidiary of the HBC. In 1886 Nanaimo had 22 saloon licences at a cost of \$300 each and this was the primary source of revenue for the city.

All participants must be at least 19 years of age. Tour begins at the Nanaimo Museum at 100 Museum Way. Pre-registration and payment is required. This is BRFM's 4th year of serving the community. This is Nanaimo's food-oriented market promoting the 100 mile diet and connecting the people of our community with the farmers in our region who grow and raise the food we eat, as well as small-scale food processors and unique artisans. Farmers markets throughout Canada find that true "farmers" markets flourish when the focus on food is a minimum of 75%, and that is what this market adheres to.

A bit about the purpose, vision and goals of farmers' markets.

As background, it is important to be aware that in 1900, 90% of Canadians were involved in agriculture and now it is less than 4%. In 1960, 60% of our food was grown on Vancouver Island and now it is less than 6%. These "facts" put farming, food, agri-culture and land use into a broader perspective!

The purpose of our farmers' market is:

to bring people together in our community within the context of food, farming, health, nutrition and relationship. This also provides an opportunity for people to reconnect with themselves, each other, the earth, soil, water, air and sun which are some of the many elements employed by our local farmers and food producers in order to bring some of the less than 6% of our food grown on Vancouver Island!

The vision is: for us all to become re-aquainted with our world and how our food, food production and eating of food fits into the world and all it's peoples and creatures.

The goal is: that from this place of awareness of the inter-relationship of all things that we continue to make individual changes leading to cultural shifts that move us all in a direction that is more harmonious and sustainable.
