
#### MURALS OF CHEMAINUS

The blueprint for mural art in BC, the Chemainus Mural Project began in 1981 and has drawn countless visitors ever since.

The site includes 40 murals and 10 sculptures depicting Chemainus' colourful past, including five murals inspired by Emily Carr. You can also get some physically distanced stress relief by meditating along the 40-foot labyrinth modelled after the Chartres maze in France. Established in 1987, the Chemainus Festival of Murals Society has a great website for those who cannot get to Vancouver Island but wish to enjoy their many sites from home.


