



Museum of Art & History

Touchstones Nelson: Museum of Art and History is a multi-faceted cultural hub located in downtown Nelson. They house a regional archives, history collection, regional museum, two contemporary gallery spaces and a stunning gift shop, all within a 1902 heritage post office. Exhibitions showcase both regional heritage and Contemporary Canadian art. Their mission is to encourage new perspectives and foster a collaborative and inclusive community. Open Thursdays through Sundays at noon, the first hour of each day is reserved for the immunocompromised.

CASTLEGAR SCULPTUREWALK

Castlegar, Sculpture Capital of Canada™, is home to this annual rotating exhibition of outdoor sculptures from Canadian and International artists. From May to October, viewers can stroll downtown and vote for the Winner of the People's Choice Award (ballot on the Sculpturewalk website), garnering a place in the City's permanent collection of public art. 
THE GARDEN STUDIO

Laura exhibits throughout the Kootenay region, including at ViewPoint Art Gallery in Nelson (see below). Gardens, birds, and surrounding landscape are created through collage and techniques reminiscent of art deco and stained glass. Her stylized paintings sparkle with lighthearted and expressive celebrations of nature, and often include a touch of whimsy.

Originally formed in 1969 as the Kootenay-Columbia Arts Council, NDAC is committed to promoting and encouraging cultural and artistic activities in the community while securing important grants for the arts. Advocacy, representation and education are all important in fostering greater appreciation and support of arts and culture in the Nelson area. They present a number of projects each year intended to foster the arts in Nelson and District including the Nelson ArtWalk and the Nelson International Mural Festival (Aug 14-16, 2020).




