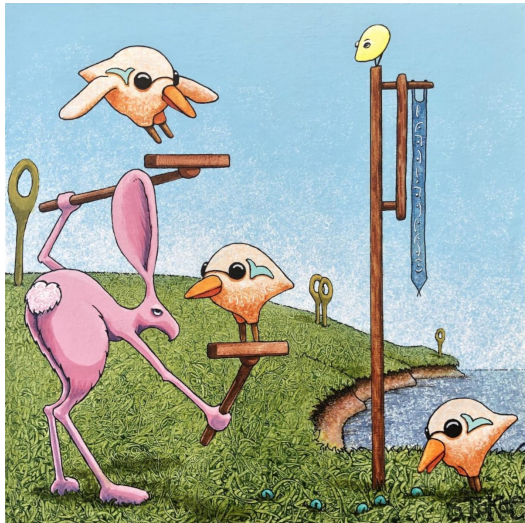
MURALS OF CHEMAINUS Year-Round

VIRTUAL NELSON ART WALK

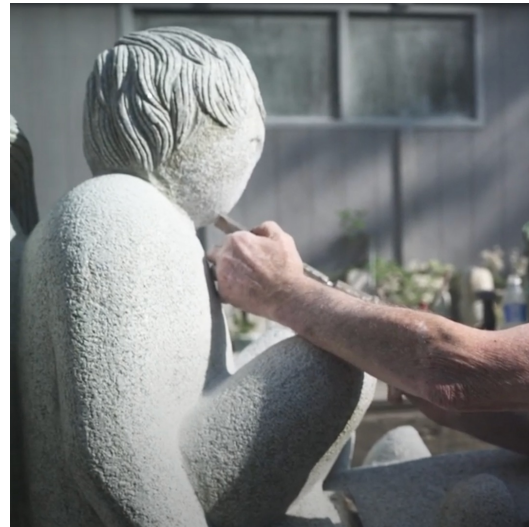

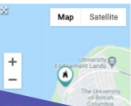
