Kariton Gallery @ Abbotsford Art Council

Established in 1971, the Abbotsford Arts Council acts as a resource for local artists while promoting the vision, creativity, and energy of the Abbotsford community through the arts. Over 70 local arts, heritage, and culture organizations receive support under the umbrella of the *Abbotsford Arts Council*, and the talents of hundreds of local artists are showcased by the Abbotsford Arts Council each year at the Kariton Art Gallery as well as programs and events that are family-friendly and open to the entire community.



BC Farm Museum

Located in historic Fort Langley the BC Farm Museum has the province's largest collection of pioneer and agricultural artifacts.

Something of interest for every age. Kids love their Scavenger Hunt (with a prize) and rope-making, tomato and egg-sorting demonstrations.

Visitors learn how people lived without electricity and can see first-hand several wooden ice boxes (early refrigerators) see early windmills that pump water and produce light.... nearing 100 years old and still running!

The collection of artifacts by the Association has evolved from focusing on farming equipment only, to including historical artifacts depicting all aspects of pioneer life. Our artifacts bring back many memories of how folks lived. Remembering what life was like as a kid. Seeing the transition from horsepower to engines.

The Museum collection has grown to over 5,600 historical artifacts of farming equipment and pioneer life in British Columbia, on display in two buildings and an outside exhibit area.

Tourism Harrison

The friendly resort town of Harrison Hot Springs is located at the south end of Harrison Lake in the beautiful Fraser Valley.

Long known to the local First Nations, the hot springs were discovered by westerners in 1859 when paddlers capsized in winter and realized that the lake water was warm. The hot springs have made Harrison a very popular destination with people from all corners of the globe and an ideal holiday spot for Vancouverites just a short 90-minute drive from the Port Mann Bridge.

Harrison also boasts great events



The Hope, Cascades & Canyons Visitor Centre is the ideal place to start your adventure.

The Hope Arts Gallery offers approximately 2,000 square feet of exhibition space for local artists. They also feature special monthly shows in the Back Room showcasing artists from throughout the Province.

Heaven n' Earth Native Art - Mother and daughter team, Teresa Walker and Brook Tobacco make authentic handmade Indigenous products. Their shop features items such as mixed media beadwork, pine needle, birch bark, cedar bark jewelry, and baskets.
